By entering this subaward, Pierce College commits to working towards the broad goals and objectives, as described in the project narrative submitted to and approved by the National Science Foundation.

The PS Alliance's goal over the three-year LSAMP grant period is to strengthen under-represented minority (URM) STEM students' STEM identities and significantly increase the number of URM students who transfer from Puget Sound Alliance colleges to baccalaureate STEM programs of study at four-year institutions. The project will serve underrepresented minority STEM students, "LSAMP Scholars," at two different levels of involvement, termed as "Scholars" and "Members" below in Table 1.

All LSAMP Scholars must: (1) identify as African American, Hispanic American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian, Native Pacific Islander, or Filipino; and (2) be pursuing two-year STEM transfer degrees.

The PSAlliance Objectives over the three-year grant period are:

- Objective 1: Increase enrollment by at least 25% for students from historically underrepresented communities in STEM, from a baseline of 785 students to at least 981 students.
- Objective 2: Increase the associate in science (AS) degree completion rate of LSAMP-eligible students by at least 50%, from a baseline of 42 students to at least 63 students.
- Objective 3: Increase the university transfer rate of LSAMP-eligible students by at least 40%, from a baseline of 162 students to at least 223 students.
- Objective 4: Engage at least 270 LSAMP Members and 250 LSAMP Scholars in activities that support their retention, completion and transfer, and foster their senses of belonging and community.
- Objective 5: Establish and implement three new student retention strategies: mental health and basic needs support; experiential learning opportunities; and improved, centralized faculty mentor training.

Table 1 lists the proposed number of LSAMP Members and Scholars for the three years for all three colleges that form the alliance.

Pierce College must ensure that all its Level 1 LSAMP Scholars:

- Receive mentorship from a trained faculty member.
- Attend a project orientation session and ongoing advising.
- Engage in undergraduate research, and/or at least one leadership or service-learning activity (e.g., working as a peer tutor)*
- Apply to a paid or unpaid* STEM internship or REU program.
- Attend an annual Alliance-wide meeting or comparable symposium.
- Seek adequate financial aid with a preference for full-time enrollment.

Pierce College will ensure that all of its Level 2 LSAMP Members:

- Receive tutoring or mentoring from Level 1 LSAMP Scholar(s) in years 2 and 3.
- Attend PSAlliance university tours, field trips, or workshops.
- Participate in on-campus undergraduate research symposia.

I. Individual responsibilities

The Vice President, Learning & Student Success, Dr. Yuritzi Lozano: This individual will sit on the PSAlliance Governing Board, which will meet at least once a quarter. The Governing Board, led by North Seattle College's President, is responsible for overseeing general project operations and ensuring that the alliance's goals/objectives are achieved. The purpose of the Board is to provide global perspective, direction, and assistance in broadening the base of support for the implementation and sustainability of LSAMP activities.

Co-Primary Investigators, Elysia Mbuja, from Pierce College will:

- Serve on the PSAlliance Leadership Team, which will meet at least once per academic term to review formative evaluation data, assess the implementation of the project's work plan, establish and update PSAlliance-wide policies and procedures, and share best practices between colleges.
- Serve as the point-person for all campus-specific activities (see list of minimum activities below);
- Obtain, coordinate, and evaluate the support of colleges' STEM academic programs of study and related personnel (e.g. faculty mentors) for project events/ activities and LSAMP Scholars.
- Supervise college's PSAlliance Campus Coordinator.
- Collect, prepare, and submit to PSAlliance Manager, project evaluation and data (See description of evaluation requirements below).
- Create, document, and disseminate college-specific procedures and communications, including web presence.
- Participate in dissemination activities.
- Serve as a liaison with the college's programs and offices to coordinate services for LSAMP Scholars.
- Participate in the PSAlliance Community of Practice
- Manage the subaward for Pierce.

The **PSAlliance Administrative Specialist at Pierce College** is responsible for working with the Program Administrator and Co-PIs to:

- Plan, manage, monitor, and evaluate the college's PSAlliance-specific outreach, retention, and transfer activities.
- Manage the facilities primarily used by LSAMP Scholars.
- Serve as a liaison (with co-PIs) with local partner institutions to conduct joint activities, at the direction of the PSAlliance Manager.
- Prepare and update rosters of current/prospective LSAMP Scholars.
- Monitor and check in with Level 1 Scholars at least monthly.
- Perform day-to-day administrative and fiscal management of NSF subaward funds
- Represent/ advocate for the PSAlliance with campus stakeholders

I. General College Responsibilities

The proposed work plan (identified as Appendix A found in link: <u>Puget Sound Alliance Work Plan</u>) in the PSAlliance Project Narrative describes three primary areas of focus for each college:

- Outreach and Onboarding
- Retention
- Transfer

The work plan provides each college with wide latitude for how it will implement the project on its campus. Pierce College must:

- Implement activities within each broad area.
- Engage partners as described in the workplan and partner commitment letters.

- Designate a physical space, where students can participate in the activities. The STEM Center at Pierce College will fulfil this requirement.
- Engage its STEM faculty in the project.
- Provide the required services to its LSAMP Scholars, as described above in the description of Level 1 LSAMP Scholars.
- Participate in the project evaluation by providing data to the Co-PI at North Seattle College and working with the external evaluator.

II. North Seattle College Responsibilities

As the lead college North Seattle College will do the following:

- Coordinate the PSAlliance's overall work, including planning, conducting, and evaluating Alliance-wide activities and events.
- Coordinate the Governing Board and Leadership Team.
- Hire, supervise, and evaluate the PSAlliance Manager. Fifty percent (50%) of the Manager's time will focus on coordinating the overall PSAlliance.
- Coordinate the work of the college-specific Co-PIs.
- Coordinate the PSAlliance's professional Community of Practice.
- Create, document, and disseminate project-wide procedures and communications.
- Manage PSAlliance website and social media.
- Liaise with partner institutions and the PNW LSAMP to plan, conduct, and evaluate joint activities/events.
- Collect, prepare and submit required project and performance data via NSF's WebAMP reporting tool.
- Gather from Co-PIs, compile, and report/present project evaluation data to the PSAlliance Governing Board.
- Serve as the primary contact for the External Evaluator.
- Perform day-to-day administrative and fiscal management of NSF grant.
- Submit annual reports to the National Science Foundation.

III. Timeline

Pierce College has latitude in implementing the LSAMP activities in a time and manner that accommodates students on its campus. Its focus must be on implementing the project in a way that meets the objectives described in Section 1.
